是次交流讓我們對韓國文化及教育模式有更深的認識,真是獲 益良多。

首先,韓國文化方面,我們於行程第一天便到了景福宮參觀, 有幸得到當地的學生為我們導賞,讓我們可以更深入了解韓國古代 文化。朝鮮的傳統建築與中國傳統建築有很多相似之處,細察景福 宮的建築細節就可以看見他們深受儒家思想影響。

其次、社會方面、韓國人十分注重禮儀、對於長幼有序、貴賤有等的觀念十分注重、可以說是「比中國更中國」、但於平日活動時卻較粗魯。他們貧富懸殊的問題也頗嚴重、自殺率也相當高、這是由於當地的大財閥已壟斷各大小產業、小企業的生存空間較少、造成貧富懸殊;而自殺率高是由於韓國人的自尊心重、像選舉前他們便會認為自己已經獲勝、如果失敗便會感到蓋恥。另外、值得香港借鏡的是他們十分注重環保、於近年開始垃圾收費、在街上亦較少看見垃圾桶。

教育方面,我們參觀了韓國的大學和中學,其實當地學生的壓力亦不比香港小,韓國的學生如果沒有補習則會視為家長的不負責任;而且韓國的留學風氣十分盛行,家長在子女的教育方面花費巨大;韓國的學生為了考入名門大學「S. K. Y. (首爾大學、高麗大學、延世大學)」則要十分用功,大學的學生導遊告訴我們要考上名牌大學是十分艱難的,因為他們認為如果考進名牌大學你的未來就一片光明。

在本次的韓國首爾團,我們可以知道更多韓國的文化、社會制度與教育等方面的資訊,令我們可以增廣見聞,對其他地區亦有更深入的了解,也能藉以反思自己可以改進之處。

In October this year, nearly 120 form four students participated in a 5-days Korean Cultural Exchange Tour at Seoul organized by our school. During the tour, I did not only deeply understand the unique culture of Korea, but also gained more meaningful experience in the process of communication and interaction, especially during the visit of the Jangpyung Middle School.

We visited local high schools and universities at Seoul. Before the tour, I was curious about and fantasized the Korean education system. I wanted to know more about "Is it easy to study at Seoul? How does the student progress? How does the class work?" We were warmly greeted by the teachers and students when we arrived at the Jangpyung Middle School. At the same time, the giant football field impressed me much!

The Korean students brought us to have a school tour. We visited different classrooms for different subjects, such as the History Room for the history class. The size of the classrooms was bigger than that in Hong Kong. It seemed that the schools in Seoul have a lot of education resources. Furthermore, the Korean students explained that they have to learn 16 subjects, including the National Ethics and Mandarin!

During the school visit, I asked my new Korean friend about the Korean learning atmosphere. Like Hong Kong, Korea also has a spoon-feed education culture. Korea students may even have to attend the tutorial class till 10' o clock in the evening! It showed that Korean students were facing a fierce competition for getting into the three well-known universities, collectively known as "SKY" in Seoul.

As we could see, the students were taking their schoolwork seriously. It makes studying in Korea really intense. And the students there feel depressed easily.

Meanwhile, Koreans emphasize the daily practice of the Confucianism. You may feel a bit confused about it. Even if you know your relatives very well, you still need to talk to those who are older than you politely. If you spoke in a casual way, the Koreans would not appreciate you as a nice person but regard you as an impolite person. There is a huge cultural gap between us. Maybe we still need to take a long time to get used to it.

To sum up, studying in Korea, you need to face the pressure and cultural differences. When you learn more about their culture and gain more experience, you will be an open-minded person.
